Dr. Theodore Richard Bromund received his BA in History, *summa cum laude* with honors, from Grinnell College in Grinnell, Iowa in 1991, his M.A. in History from Yale University in 1996, and his Ph.D. in History from Yale in 1999. From 1999 to 2008, he was the Associate Director of International Security Studies at Yale, a center for the study of international, diplomatic, military, and strategic history, and a Lecturer in the Department of History. In 2008, he joined The Heritage Foundation’s Margaret Thatcher Center for Freedom as the inaugural Margaret Thatcher Senior Research Fellow, a term-limited position, and in 2012 he became the Senior Research Fellow in Anglo-American Relations in the Thatcher Center. From 2011-18, he was an Adjunct Professor of Strategic Studies in the Johns Hopkins University’s School of Advanced International Studies. He publishes regularly in many outlets, including his bimonthly column in *Newsday* which began in 2013.
