

Brad Brooks-Rubin serves as the Policy Director at The Sentry and Policy Advisor to the Enough Project. In this capacity, he helps to lead the efforts of The Sentry to disrupt the corrupt networks who fund and profit from genocide or other mass atrocities in Africa. Brad is the co-author of an Enough Project report from April 2016 called *Modernized Sanctions for Sudan* and co-author of several op-eds focused on the opportunities for the U.S. and other governments to deploy stronger sanctions, anti-money laundering, and other financial pressures to stop genocide and advance peace and human rights in sub-Saharan Africa.

From 2009-2013, Brad served as the Special Advisor for Conflict Diamonds at the United States Department of State. At the Department of State, he also contributed to U.S. efforts related to conflict minerals in eastern Congo, particularly in the area of corporate due diligence. Prior to joining the Department of State, Brad served as an Attorney-Adviser in the Treasury Department's Office of the Chief Counsel (Foreign Assets Control), where he provided advice on a range of economic sanctions issues related to Sudan, the former Liberian regime of Charles Taylor, Democratic Republic of the Congo, and counter-terrorism.

Prior to and following his government service, Brad has worked at two law firms in the area of international trade compliance, advising a wide range of companies on economic sanctions and trade controls. Brad is a graduate of Washington University in St. Louis and Georgetown University Law Center.
