

## **Dr. Paul D. Williams Biography**

Paul D. Williams is Associate Professor in the Elliott School of International Affairs at the George Washington University where he is also Associate Director of the Security Policy Studies MA program. Dr Williams received his Ph.D. in international politics from the University of Wales, Aberystwyth (2001). His research focuses on the politics of contemporary peace operations and the dynamics of war and peace in Africa. He worked previously at the universities of Warwick and Birmingham in the UK, has been a visiting scholar at Georgetown University and the University of Queensland, a visiting professor at Addis Ababa University, and a fellow with the Woodrow Wilson Center for International Scholars and the International Peace Institute. Dr Williams' books include *Fighting for Peace in Somalia: A history and analysis of the African Union Mission, 2007-2017* (Oxford University Press, 2018); *War and Conflict in Africa* (Polity, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 2016); *The Oxford Handbook of United Nations Peacekeeping Operations* (Oxford University Press, 2015); *Enhancing U.S. Support for Peace Operations in Africa* (Council on Foreign Relations Special Report No.73, 2015); and *Understanding Peacekeeping* (Polity, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 2010).
