

Susan Waltz is a professor of public policy at the Ford School of Public Policy, University of Michigan. She is a specialist in human rights and international affairs with regional expertise on North Africa. Waltz is author of *Human Rights and Reform: Changing the Face of North African Politics* (1995) and a series of articles on the historical origins of international human rights instruments. She also maintains the website [Human Rights Advocacy and the History of International Human Rights Standards](#), hosted by the University of Michigan.

For some fifteen years she was also involved in international efforts to promote the international Arms Trade Treaty, concluded in 2013. From 1993-99 Dr. Waltz served on Amnesty International's International Executive Committee and since 2000 she has served terms on the national boards of the American Friends Service Committee and Amnesty International USA. Dr. Waltz received her PhD in international studies from the University of Denver.
