Jason Marczak is Director of the Latin America Economic Growth Initiative at the Atlantic Council's Adrienne Arsht Latin America Center. He joined the Atlantic Council in October 2013 to help launch the Arsht Center. With Marczak's co-leadership, the Center has become known for its insight on the transforming Latin America and the region's strategic role in the global community, including its groundbreaking polling work on US attitudes toward Cuba. He is at the forefront of its forward-looking analysis on issues such as trade and commerce, US-Cuba relations, Latin America 2030, Mexico's reforms, China–Latin America, innovation, energy, and Brazil. Mr. Marczak frequently publishes in major media outlets and provides English- and Spanish-language commentary on political and economic issues in Latin America, including a weekly appearance on Bloomberg TV in Mexico.

Mr. Marczak previously served as Director of Policy at Americas Society/Council of the Americas in New York City where he was a Cofounder of *Americas Quarterly* magazine and led national and international working groups of corporate executives and senior policymakers. Mr. Marczak has also served in positions at the U.S. House of Representatives, the National Endowment for Democracy, and the Andean Community General Secretariat, and was a founding member of Partners of the Americas' Center for Civil Society. He received a bachelor's degree from Tufts University and a master's degree in International Affairs and Economics from the Johns Hopkins University Paul Nitze School of Advanced International Studies. In addition, Mr. Marczak is a board member of Qualitas of Life Foundation and a term member of the Council on Foreign Relations where he served as a member of its 2014 North America Task Force.
