**RE: NAACP STRONG SUPPORT FOR H.R. 51, THE *WASHINGTON, D.C. ADMISSION ACT***

Dear Representative ,

On behalf of the NAACP, our nation's oldest, largest and most widely-recognized grassroots-based civil rights organization, I would strongly urge you to support and co-sponsor H.R.51, the *Washington, D.C. Admission Act*. H.R. 51 is a crucial bill working to ensure fairness and equality in Congress for the tax paying residents of the District of Columbia who do not currently have voting representation in matters directly impacting their day-to-day life.

Despite the fact that D.C. residents pay federal taxes, serve on juries and defend our nation in times of war, the residents of the District of Columbia are barred from having voting representation on the floor of the U.S. House of Representatives or the U.S. Senate. This classic example of "taxation without representation" is contrary to everything upon which our country was founded. The residents of the District of Columbia pay more federal taxes per capita than all but one other state. Moreover, due to the District's unique status, the federal government receives and spends \$4 billion from the people of D.C. without fair representation.

Residents of D.C. are not being fairly represented by the federal government. Congress consistently interferes with D.C. laws; dictating what the city can and cannot do and how it may spend its own money. Congress has the ability to act in direct opposition to D.C. residents without giving these Americans a voting voice in the process.

The issue of D.C. statehood disproportionately impacts African Americans. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, almost half of the over 700,000 people living in D.C. identify themselves as being black American, despite the fact that we make up just over 13 percent of the overall American population. These hard-working Americans are paying money to and dying for a government in which they have no voice.
