

**AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE  
TO H.R. 7340  
OFFERED BY MRS. CAROLYN B. MALONEY OF  
NEW YORK**

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 **SEC. 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Chai Suthammanont  
3 Remembrance Act of 2020”.

4 **SEC. 2. TELEWORK, LEAVE, AND RETURNING TO WORK FOR  
5 FEDERAL EMPLOYEES.**

6 (a) **ISSUANCE OF POLICIES AND PROCEDURES BY**  
7 **AGENCIES.**—Not later than 30 days before the date on  
8 which an agency plans to reopen a facility and after con-  
9 sultation with the Chief Human Capital Officer and direc-  
10 tor of administration or the equivalent, the head of an  
11 agency shall publish on the website of that agency a re-  
12 opening plan that details the procedures and policies re-  
13 lated to sending employees back to workstations during  
14 the covered period that includes the following:

15 (1) The personal protective equipment that will  
16 be provided by the agency, the additional cleaning

1 protocols to be implemented, and efforts to ensure  
2 social distancing at worksites.

3 (2) The actions the agency will take to protect  
4 employees who are required to work in locations out-  
5 side of Federal office buildings for activities such as  
6 audits and inspections.

7 (3) The requirements that members of the pub-  
8 lic must meet in order to enter Federal office spaces.

9 (4) A description of the proper contingencies  
10 for employees who have a high risk of contracting  
11 coronavirus.

12 (5) Ensures the continuity of operations, in-  
13 cluding plans to reverse reopening measures if there  
14 is a resurgence in coronavirus cases in certain geo-  
15 graphic areas.

16 (b) INSPECTORS GENERAL REVIEW.—Not later than  
17 6 months after the date of the enactment of this section,  
18 the inspector general for each agency shall submit to the  
19 Committee on Oversight and Reform of the House of Rep-  
20 resentatives and the Committee on Homeland Security  
21 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a review on  
22 whether that agency has provided adequate personal pro-  
23 tective equipment for the employees who are returning to  
24 a Federal office location for the agency and published the

1 policies and procedures required pursuant to subsection  
2 (a).

3 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

4 (1) AGENCY.—The term “agency” has the  
5 meaning given that term in section 551 of title 5,  
6 United States Code.

7 (2) COVERED PERIOD.—The term “covered pe-  
8 riod” means a period during which a nationwide dec-  
9 laration of a public health emergency by the Sec-  
10 retary of Health and Human Services under section  
11 319 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.  
12 247d) is in effect.
