A BILL

To require the Archivist of the United States to submit a plan to Congress to eliminate the records backlog at the National Personnel Records Center, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Access for Veterans
5 to Records Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PLAN TO ELIMINATE RECORDS BACKLOG AT THE**
2 **NATIONAL PERSONNEL RECORDS CENTER.**

3 (a) **PLAN REQUIRED.**—Not later than 60 days after
4 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Archivist of the
5 United States shall submit to the Committee on Oversight
6 and Reform of the House of Representatives and the
7 Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee
8 of the Senate a plan for reducing the backlog of requests
9 for records from the National Personnel Records Center
10 that includes, at a minimum, the following:

11 (1) Target timeframes to reduce the backlog.

12 (2) A detailed plan for improving the informa-
13 tion technology infrastructure to prevent future
14 backlogs.

15 (3) Actions to improve customer service for re-
16 questers.

17 (b) **AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**—In addi-
18 tion to amounts otherwise available, there is authorized
19 to be appropriated to the National Archives and Records
20 Administration, \$60,000,000 to address backlogs in re-
21 sponding to requests from veterans for military personnel
22 records, improve cybersecurity, improve digital preserva-
23 tion and access to archival Federal records, and address
24 backlogs in requests made under section 552 of title 5,
25 United States Code (commonly referred to as the Freedom

1 of Information Act). Such amounts may also be used for
2 the Federal Records Center Program.
