Re: Committee Business Meeting

On **Wednesday, May 20, 2026, at 10:00 a.m. ET, in room 2154 of the Rayburn House Office Building**, the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform will hold a business meeting to consider the following:

1. H.R. 8096, Duplication Scoring Act of 2026
2. H.R. 8801, DC Rejecting Oppressive Automotive Driving Surcharges Act
3. H.R. 8844, U.S. Customs and Border Protection Officer Retirement Technical
4. H.R. 3087, Civil Rights Cold Case Records Collection Reauthorization Act
5. Several postal naming measures.

I. H.R. 8096, Duplication Scoring Act of 2026:

A. Summary

This bill establishes reporting requirements for duplicative federal programs by amending title 31 of the U.S. Code to require the Comptroller General of the U.S. to analyze certain legislation reported by Congressional Committees to prevent duplication of and overlap with existing Federal programs, offices, and initiatives. It also requires the Comptroller General to share its findings with the Committee of jurisdiction and the public through GAO's website.

II. H.R. 8801, DC Rejecting Oppressive Automotive Driving Surcharges (DC ROADS) Act:

A. Summary

This bill amends Section 602(a) of the D.C. Home Rule Act (D.C. Code sec. 1-206.02(a)) to prohibit authorization from the D.C. Council to enact, and the D.C. Mayor to enforce, a congestion traffic toll in the District of Columbia. This would include any congestion toll for entry into or passing through congestion tolling zones (e.g., D.C. roads, bridges, tunnels).

III. H.R. 8844, U.S. Customs and Border Protection Officer Retirement Technical Corrections Act:

A. Summary

This bill modifies the calculation of retirement benefits for a group of U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officers. Effective July 6, 2008, Congress authorized enhanced retirement benefits for CBP officers that met maximum age and minimum service requirements. A small group of officers received tentative offers of

employment before July 6, 2008, but started work on or after that date. This bill specifies that officers who received a tentative employment offer before July 6, 2008, but started work on or after that date are entitled to proportional annuity. This bill also directs the Government Accountability Office (GAO) to report on CBP processes regarding the enhanced benefit to ensure proper management and implementation.

IV. H.R. 3087, Civil Rights Cold Case Records Collection Reauthorization Act:

A. Summary

The bill extends the Civil Rights Cold Case Review Board through January 8, 2030, and grants the Board additional and modified authorities. Specifically, the bill directs states and local governments to transmit cold case records to the Archivist and authorizes the Board to reimburse states and local governments for digitizing, photocopying, or mailing a record to transmit these records to the Archivist. Additionally, the bill allows personnel and medical files to be publicly released if the records are related to a cold case record created on or before January 1, 1990.

V. POSTAL NAMING MEASURES:

H.R. 3350 - To designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 340 East 1st Street in Tustin, California, as the "Ursula Ellen Kennedy Post Office Building". - Rep. Young Kim (R-CA)

H.R. 4662 - To designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 6444 San Fernando Road in Glendale, California, as the "Paul Ignatius Post Office". - Rep. Laura Friedman (D-CA)

H.R. 8669 - To designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 5951 Riverdale Avenue in Bronx, New York, as the "Eliot L. Engel Post Office". - Rep. Richie Torres (D-NY)

VI. AMENDMENT PROCESS:

Committee Rule 2(g) authorizes the Chair of the Committee to prioritize the consideration of amendments filed 24 hours in advance of the consideration of matters before the Committee or subcommittees. Pursuant to this rule, and at the Chair's discretion, the Committee may consider amendments that are pre-filed with the Committee clerk prior to amendments offered at a markup.

Members should pre-file amendments with the clerk of the Committee by emailing a searchable, electronic PDF copy of the amendment prepared by the House Legislative Counsel directly to GOP Oversight Clerks at GOP.Oversight.Clerks@mail.house.gov and Alexandra Kilduff at Alexandra.Kilduff@mail.house.gov at least 24 hours before the scheduled start of the business meeting. Members should include in the email accompanying the amendment text:

1. The name(s) of the Member(s) who will offer the amendment;
2. The name and number of the measure to be amended;
3. A brief, one-sentence description of the amendment; and
4. The name and phone number of a staff member who will serve as the point of contact for the amendment.

Pre-filed amendments will be compiled into a single roster, and the roster will be made available to Committee members prior to business meetings. Any amendment to a measure or matter before the Committee or a Subcommittee should be germane to the measure or matter, including in scope, subject matter, and Committee consideration. Votes on amendments likely will be grouped together at a time determined by the chair, pursuant to Committee Rules.
