I. H.R. 6610, Pharmacists Fight Back [in Federal Employee Health Benefit Plans Act]

A. Summary

The bill proscribes terms, requirements, and prohibitions for the Federal Employee Health Benefit (FEHB) program plan contracting with Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs). Specifically, the bill requires PBMs to reimburse pharmacies and effectively apply the amount of pharmaceutical manufacturer rebates to the amount beneficiaries pay for respective prescription drugs. The bill prohibits PBMs from “steering” beneficiaries towards certain pharmacies and imposes noncompliance penalties, subject to specified hearing and appeals processes.

II. H.R. 9720, D.C. Taxing Authority Review Act:

A. Summary

The D.C. Taxing Authority Review Act would require a joint resolution of approval by Congress of Acts of the District of Columbia that would impose or increase a tax or fee. Such an Act of D.C. would not take effect unless a joint resolution of approval is passed within 60 days of when the Act is transmitted by the Chairman of the D.C. Council to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate. Debate on such Acts in either Chamber would not exceed one hour, ensuring expedited consideration of the approval measure.

III. H.R. 9725, Restoring Integrity and Efficiency to Inspector General Oversight Act of 2025:

A. Summary

The bill abolishes the Council of Inspectors General for Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE) 1-year after enactment and transfers CIGIE resources and certain government-wide Inspectors General (IG) oversight functions under title 5 of U.S. Code to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), including the development of policies and standards for the IG workforce, coordination of governmentwide IG audit and investigation activities to address Federal programs and operations, and mediation of multi-jurisdiction disputes. The bill also requires the Comptroller General to develop inspection standards for IG offices and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers to maintain academies for professional training of the IG workforce. The bill removes references to CIGIE from other federal government-wide management laws.

IV. H. R. 9643, Comment Integrity and Management Act:

A. Summary

The bill amends Section 206 of the E-Government Act of 2002 to improve the management of electronic comments submitted during agency rulemaking. The bill requires agencies to verify that any electronic comment was submitted by a human and provides agencies with additional authorities to assist with the management of mass-generated comments that are identical or nearly identical in substance. This bill also requires agencies to post policies regarding how the agency will consider computer-generated and mass comments on the website that is used to collect electronic comments during the rulemaking process. The bill also requires the Office of Management and Budget to issue guidance to agencies regarding technologies that can be used to manage computer-generated and mass comments.

VII. AMENDMENT PROCESS:

Committee Rule 2(g) authorizes the Chair of the Committee to prioritize the consideration of amendments filed 24 hours in advance of the consideration of matters before the Committee or subcommittees. Pursuant to this rule, and at the Chair's discretion, the Committee may consider amendments that are pre-filed with the Committee clerk prior to amendments offered at a markup.

Members should pre-file amendments with the clerk of the Committee by emailing a searchable, electronic PDF copy of the amendment prepared by the House Legislative Counsel directly to GOP Oversight Clerks at GOP.Oversight.Clerks@mail.house.gov and Alexandra Kilduff at Alexandra.Kilduff@mail.house.gov at least 24 hours before the scheduled start of the business meeting. Members should include in the email accompanying the amendment text:

1. The name(s) of the Member(s) who will offer the amendment;
2. The name and number of the measure to be amended;
3. A brief, one-sentence description of the amendment; and
4. The name and phone number of a staff member who will serve as the point of contact for the amendment.

Pre-filed amendments will be compiled into a single roster, and the roster will be made available to Committee members prior to business meetings. Any amendment to a measure or matter before the Committee or a Subcommittee should be germane to the measure or matter, including in scope, subject matter, and Committee consideration. Votes on amendments likely will be grouped together at a time determined by the chair, pursuant to Committee Rules.
