



Anthony Salisbury
Acting Deputy Executive Associate Director
Homeland Security Investigations

Anthony Salisbury is currently the Acting Deputy Executive Associate Director for Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), the principal investigative component of the Department of Homeland Security. HSI is responsible for investigating, disrupting, and dismantling transnational criminal organizations and terrorist networks that threaten or seek to exploit the laws of the United States. HSI's workforce consists of over 10,000 employees, including special agents, criminal analysts, missions support personnel, and contract staff, assigned to more than 237 offices throughout the United States and over 56 countries around the world.

Prior to this assignment Mr. Salisbury served as the Special Agent in Charge for HSI Miami. Mr. Salisbury had oversight of the full spectrum of investigative activities for more than 400 employees, covering an area of responsibility (AOR) from Ft. Pierce to Key West, Florida. Under Mr. Salisbury's leadership, investigations were conducted to counter narcotics trafficking, violent crime, commercial fraud, counter proliferations, money laundering, human smuggling, and trafficking. Additionally, Mr. Salisbury oversaw the HSI intelligence program in South Florida.

Previously, Mr. Salisbury served in several key leadership positions for HSI. As the Section Chief for HSI's Trade Transparency Unit, he facilitated money laundering investigations across all HSI AORs. In this role, Mr. Salisbury was instrumental in establishing foreign trade transparency investigation units to combat trade-based money laundering around the globe. Following this headquarters assignment, Mr. Salisbury served as the Deputy Attaché in Mexico City, where he oversaw and was responsible for the activities of five HSI offices throughout the Republic of Mexico. Upon return from his international assignment, Mr. Salisbury was selected as the Resident Agent in Charge of HSI St. Louis, where he directed investigative activity across 86 counties located in Missouri and Illinois.

Mr. Salisbury began his law enforcement career as a Deputy United States Marshal. In 2001, Mr. Salisbury joined the former United States Customs Service New York Field Office, where he was assigned to investigate narcotics trafficking. Mr. Salisbury received an undergraduate degree from Missouri Western University in St. Joseph, Missouri.
