

## **Linda M. Springer**

The Honorable Linda M. Springer has four decades of experience leading and providing executive and financial management services to government agencies and commercial organizations.

Ms. Springer served as the eighth Director of the U. S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) from 2005 to 2008. Previously, Ms. Springer was Controller and head of the Office of Federal Financial Management at the White House Office of Management and Budget (OMB). Most recently, Ms. Springer served as Senior Advisor at OMB in the initial five months of the Trump Administration during which time she led the early phases of the Administration's program to reorganize the Executive Branch. From 2008 to 2015, Ms. Springer advised federal departments and agencies on management issues as an executive director in the Government and Public Sector Practice of Ernst & Young LLP.

Before her career in public service, Ms. Springer spent over twenty-five years in the financial services industry in executive roles responsible for financial and business line management, strategic and operational planning and actuarial services, including a sponsored demutualization conversion and merger worth in excess of \$1.5 billion. Her positions included Senior Vice President and Controller at Provident Mutual and Vice President and Product Manager at Penn Mutual Life Insurance Company.

Her public service involvements have included director and fellow of the National Academy of Public Administration, the Partnership for Public Service, the President's Management Council, U.S. Joint Financial Management Improvement Program and the President's Council on Integrity and Efficiency. Ms. Springer led the U.S. Government Councils for Chief Human Capital, Chief Financial and Federal Real Property Officers. Her leadership was recognized by being awarded the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service. Ms. Springer's support for the veterans community was recognized with the Blinded American Veterans Foundation George W. Alexander Memorial Volunteer Award.
