Michael previously served in the Office of Inspector General (OIG) of the U.S. House of Representatives (House) as the Deputy Inspector General, Advisory and Administrative Services and as the Director, Management Advisory Services. He has been at the House since 2008.

Prior to joining the House, Michael spent over 15 years working in consulting and management roles in the financial services industry.

Mr. Ptasienski is a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and Chartered Global Management Accountant (CGMA).
