**RESOLUTION**

Directing the Secretary of Homeland Security to transmit certain documents to the House of Representatives relating to the border security policies, procedures, and activities as such relate to the interdiction of families by the U.S. Border Patrol between ports of entry.

1       *Resolved*, That, not later than 14 days after the date  
2 of the adoption of this resolution, the Secretary of Home-  
3 land Security is directed to transmit to the House of Rep-  
4 resentatives, to the extent that such information is in the  
5 possession of the Secretary, copies of any document,  
6 record, memo, correspondence, or other communication or

1 any portion of any such communication of the U.S. Border  
2 Patrol that refers or relates to the interdiction of families  
3 between ports of entry, including the following:

4 (1) U.S. Border Patrol policies, procedures, and  
5 activities as such relate to the interdiction of fami-  
6 lies between ports of entry.

7 (2) Procedures disseminated within the U.S.  
8 Border Patrol on how interdicted families, including  
9 families with small children, are to be treated and  
10 processed.

11 (3) All records made at or near the time that  
12 a family is interdicted between ports of entry by the  
13 U.S. Border Patrol from June 2016 through June  
14 2018 regarding such interdiction, including any such  
15 records or information regarding the following:

16 (A) The ages of children interdicted and  
17 what actions were taken with respect to such  
18 children.

19 (B) The number of criminal referrals made  
20 by the U.S. Border Patrol, including for traf-  
21 ficking children.
