

1 (A) \$7,599,000,000, to remain available
2 until September 30, 2030, for the purposes of
3 carrying out section 254(h) of the Communica-
4 tions Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 254(h)) and its
5 existing regulations for an eligible school or li-
6 brary.

7 (B) \$1,000,000, to remain available until
8 September 30, 2030, for the Inspector General
9 of the Commission to conduct oversight of sup-
10 port provided under subsection (b).

11 (3) RELATIONSHIP TO UNIVERSAL SERVICE
12 CONTRIBUTIONS.—Support provided shall be pro-
13 vided from amounts made available from the Emer-
14 gency Connectivity Fund and not from contributions
15 under section 254(d) of the Communications Act of
16 1934 (47 U.S.C. 254(d)).

17 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

18 (1) COMMISSION.—The term “Commission”
19 means the Federal Communications Commission.

20 (2) ELIGIBLE SCHOOL OR LIBRARY.—The term
21 “eligible school or library” means an elementary
22 school, secondary school, or library (including a
23 Tribal elementary school, Tribal secondary school, or
24 Tribal library) eligible for support under paragraphs
25 (1)(B) and (2) of section 254(h) of the Communica-

1 tions Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 254(h)), provided such
2 school is providing in-person instruction 5 days per
3 week, and provided that such library is open for in
4 person patronage 5 days per week.

5 (3) EMERGENCY CONNECTIVITY FUND.—The
6 term “Emergency Connectivity Fund” means the
7 fund established under subsection (b)(1).
