**[Amendment to Committee Print of H.R. 2347, as favorably reported by the Subcommittee on Health on July 15, 2021]**

Page 2, strike line 23 and all that follows through page 3, line 20.

Page 3, line 21, redesignate subsection (c) as subsection (b).

Page 4, line 16, strike “a separate charge for” and insert “consistent with CPT code 90461, or any successor code, a fee addressing both”.

Page 4, line 17, insert “separate” after “for each”.

Page 4, line 18, strike “charge” and insert “fee”.

Page 5, line 10, redesignate subsection (d) as subsection (c).

Page 7, strike lines 6 through 9 and insert the following:

1                   (A) by striking “and section 6008 of the  
2                   Families First Coronavirus Response Act” and  
3                   inserting “, section 6008 of the Families First

1           Coronavirus Response Act, and subsection (jj)”;

Page 7, line 16, redesignate subsection (e) as sub-

Page 7, line 20, strike “control” and insert “Con-  
trol”.

Page 8, strike line 4 and all that follows through  
line 20 and insert the following:.

Page 8, strike, on line 23, “an analysis of” and all  
that follows through, on line 25, “this Act on”.

Page 9, strike lines 1 through 6, and insert the fol-  
lowing:

9           1928 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
