#### SILIENCE.

5 (a) APPROPRIATION.—In addition to amounts other-6 wise made available, there is appropriated to the Department of Commerce for fiscal year 2022, out of any money 7 8 in the Treasurv not otherwise appropriated. 9 \$10,000,000,000, to remain available until expended, ex-10 cept that no amounts may be expended after September 11 30, 2031, to support the resilience, diversity, security, and 12 strength of critical manufacturing supply chains affecting 13 interstate commerce and related administrative costs.

14 (b) PURPOSES.—The amount under subsection (a)15 shall be available to the Secretary of Commerce for—

16 (1) critical manufacturing supply chain map17 ping and monitoring, which may include providing
18 grants and other financial assistance as appropriate

to eligible entities for private and public sector-led
 mapping, monitoring, and forecasting;

3 (2) facilitating and supporting the establish4 ment of voluntary standards, guidelines, and best
5 practices to reduce risks to the resilience, diversity,
6 security, and strength of critical manufacturing sup7 ply chains;

8 (3) identifying, accelerating, promoting, and
9 demonstrating technological advances for critical
10 manufacturing supply chains; and

11 (4) providing grants and other financial assist-12 ance as appropriate that support the resilience, di-13 versity, security, or strength of a critical manufac-14 turing supply chain to eligible entities for activities 15 that may include enhancements to a domestic manu-16 facturing facility, process, or practice, the preserva-17 tion of surge capacity, the provision of goods, or 18 other activities at the determination of the Sec-19 retary.

20 (c) LIMITATION.—Of the amounts made available
21 under subsection (a), not more than 3 percent may be
22 used for related administrative expenses.

23 (d) ELIGIBLE ENTITY DEFINED.—The term "eligible
24 entity" means—

25 (1) a domestic enterprise;

3	(4) a domestic regional technology and manu-

5	(5) a domestic institution of higher education;
6	(6) a domestic public or private nonprofit orga-
