16. H.R. ___, To require the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to authorize the use of flexible air permitting with respect to certain critical energy resource facilities, and for other purposes

17. H.R. ___, To prohibit the importation into the United States of unirradiated lowenriched uranium that is produced in the Russian Federation, and for other purposes
