## **BIOGRAPHY OF**

### **KYLE PITSOR**

Kyle Pitsor was named vice president, NEMA government relations in 2004. In this capacity, Pitsor directs the Association's issue analysis and advocacy programs at federal, state, and international levels.

The National Electrical Manufacturers Association (NEMA) represents nearly 350 electrical equipment and medical imaging manufacturers that make safe, reliable, and efficient products and systems. The industry accounts for 360,000 American jobs in more than 7,000 facilities covering every state. Our industry produces \$106 billion shipments of electrical equipment and medical imaging technologies per year with \$36 billion exports.

From 1996-2004, Mr. Pitsor was industry director and managed the Association's programs for lighting, batteries, and motor/generator industries. From 1985-1996, Mr. Pitsor was senior government affairs manager handling energy, commerce, and international trade regulatory and legislative matters affecting the electrical industry. He served as staff executive in the NEMA power equipment division from 1982-1985. In addition, Mr. Pitsor served as the executive director of the National Lighting Bureau, chair of the National Lighting Collaborative, and administrator of the Lighting Controls Association.

Mr. Pitsor was appointed to the Industry Sector Advisory Committee for Capital Goods (ISAC 2) providing private sector advice to U.S. government officials on international trade matters. He also was appointed to the Department of Energy's Appliance Energy Efficiency Advisory Committee.

Prior to joining NEMA, Mr. Pitsor worked in the International Trade Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce, Washington, DC.

Mr. Pitsor attended The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University, Medford, Massachusetts for Masters of Arts degree studies from 1979-1981. He received his Bachelors of Arts degree in Political Science and International Studies from Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa in 1979.
