Christian Legal Society v. Martinez, 561 U.S. 661 (2010)

- Co-counsel at Supreme Court in case seeking to protect student association rights.

Christian Legal Society v. Walker, 453 F.3d 853 (7th Cir. 2006)

- Represented religious student organization whose recognition was revoked by public law school on the basis of a university policy prohibiting discrimination on the basis of religion and sexual orientation. Landmark victory for student group association rights.

Ass'n of Faith-Based Organizations v. Bablitch, 454 F.Supp.2d 812 (W.D. Wis. 2006)

- Lead counsel for coalition of faith-based nonprofit organizations excluded from state employee charitable campaign because the organizations limit board membership and employment positions to persons who share their religious beliefs. Victory for association rights of religious employers.

Ndayishimiye v. Sloan, Dkt. #11001867 (Arlington, VA Cir. Ct. 2011)

- Representing her family, secured emergency injunction requiring court appointed guardian to renew nutrition and hydration to incapacitated Rwandan immigrant.

California v. United States, 450 F.3d 436 (9th Cir. 2006) and 2008 WL 744840 (N.D. Cal. 2008).

- Lead counsel for pro-life medical groups intervening to defend the Weldon Amendment, a federal conscience law. Achieved unanimous decision granting intervention and prevailed in trial court.

- Represented pro-life medical groups intervening to defend the Weldon Amendment. Advanced administrative law argument not made by government defendants that was basis for victory.
