### CONTRIBUTIONS TO DIVERSITY

Diversity is a cornerstone of all of my activities in teaching, mentoring, and university service, clinical care, improving access to educational opportunities, and research. In teaching, mentoring and university service, I have mentored many race/ethnic minority and LGBTQ fellows and junior faculty and have sponsored 2 fellows for diversity supplements from the NIH. I am the MPI of a grant from the NIH - NHLBI providing training and mentoring to under-represented minority junior faculty from around the country. I have also organized a course on health disparities and social determinants of health in the Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics. My clinical care is in the general medicine clinic at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital where I care for race/ethnically diverse patients. I am the MPI of an NIH grant with San Francisco State University to increase opportunities for race/ethnically diverse undergraduates in science and have initiated and continue to help oversee a summer program for under - represented minority undergraduates in the Clinical and Translational Sciences Institute. I direct the UCSF Center for Vulnerable Populations - a research center focused on improving health and healthcare to vulnerable populations ~~my own~~ research focusses in part on cardiovascular disease disparities among poor and minority populations.

### TEACHING SUMMARY

I am engaged in both formal and informal teaching directed at medical students, residents, fellows, and junior faculty. I direct the training programs of the Clinical and Translational Sciences Institute that provides didactic training in clinical and translational science methodologies for many levels of trainees. I have helped develop the Prehealth Undergraduate Program, a summer program for undergraduates that provides an introduction to clinical and

translational research. I have led the Masters in Clinical Research Masters Seminar. In this past year, I helped develop a course on health disparities research. I am a faculty in the K Scholars Program, a career development program for junior faculty, and have been the director of this program. In the K Scholars Program I mentor junior faculty conducting translational research in weekly works in progress sessions and one-on-one. I have a K24 mid-career mentoring grant from the NIDDK and have mentored over 20 fellows and junior faculty engaged in research. I also teach residents and medical students in my capacity as an attending physician in the general medicine clinic.

I am the MPI of a Fogarty grant and have organized and taught a course in the National Institute of Public Health in Cuernavaca, Mexico for two summers on scientific research to inform policies related to prevention of cardiovascular disease, diabetes, and obesity. I am the MPI of a NHLBI-funded training program that includes a summer course in implementation science for under-represented minority faculty from around the country.

## MENTORING SUMMARY

I have devoted considerable attention to mentoring fellows and junior faculty in clinical research. I pride myself particularly in mentoring trainees from across a range of disciplines, including cardiology, nephrology, obstetrics and gynecology, health services research, epidemiology, and nursing. Mentoring is a major component of my position as a faculty member and former director of the CTSI K Scholars Program, which trains junior faculty in clinical research from across the four Schools at UCSF. We have over 50 junior faculty in the K Scholars program each year, and I personally provide career mentorship to approximately 8-10 K scholars each year. I have a K24 mid-career mentoring grant from the NIDDK and have mentored over 20 fellows and junior faculty from across multiple disciplines, medical sub-specialties, and departments. I am also the MPI of an NHLBI-funded program to provide mentorship and training to under-represented minority junior faculty from around the country conducting implementation science research in fields of interest to the NHLBI.

## RESEARCH AND CREATIVE ACTIVITIES SUMMARY

My research focuses on the prevention and treatment of cardiovascular disease, with a particular emphasis on racial disparities in disease incidence and outcomes. Using primary and secondary data analysis and techniques of both clinical epidemiology and computer simulation modeling, I have developed two areas of active study. The first is the identification of risk factors for the development of cardiovascular disease in young adults. Research in this area includes modeling the longitudinal effects of a) early and poorly treated hypertension, b) sub-clinical kidney disease, c) lifestyle factors such as obesity, and d) poor access to preventive health care services. I have focused particular attention to the development of hypertension, heart failure and chronic kidney disease in African Americans that occurs in young and middle age. The second area of interest is the development of strategies to improve the prevention, diagnosis, and management of cardiovascular disease and additionally address race, ethnic, and income disparities. Studies in this area involve a) evaluation of public health strategies to prevent early development of cardiovascular risk factors using computer simulation modeling and b) development and assessments of interventions to improve management of hypertension and heart failure, particularly in low income and race/ethnic minority populations

## **ACADEMIC LEADERSHIP**

I am the founding co-Director of the UCSF Center for Vulnerable Populations (CVP) at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital 10 years ago with Dr. Dean Schillinger and took over as the Director 3 years ago. CVP is a research center focused on communities at risk for poor health and inadequate healthcare because of social circumstances. Under my leadership CVP has grown to an annual budget of 8-10 million from grants, philanthropy, and institutional support. CVP houses 7 large center grants from the NIH, the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ), and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). I have also helped develop mid-level faculty who have expanded the reach of CVP and increased its national visibility; CVP has 20 core faculty and many more affiliate faculty from across all of the UCSF campuses. In addition to obtaining grant funding, I have help lead efforts to raise philanthropic support for the renovation of our current facility and to launch innovative new programs.



I am the director of the training programs in the UCSF Clinical and Translational Sciences Institute (CTSI) and have held this position for the past two years. Before taking this position, I had directed or played a major leadership role in every training program within the CTSI, including leading the K scholars program during its expansion to serve those with career development awards from across campus. Our K Scholars program currently serves 50-60 junior faculty annually from across all 4 schools at UCSF and has been influential in establishing a cadre of junior and now mid-level faculty trained in clinical and translational research and the conduct of collaborative, multi-disciplinary science. Under my leadership, CTSI has expanded the undergraduate training programs through additional NIH funding to include programs to enhance the pipeline of under-represented minority students. We are developing a new online certificate program in implementation sciences, and I have helped to expand interest in this program through my work within the NHLBI and the NINDS to increase training opportunities for junior faculty nationally. With others in the CTSI, I helped to craft the successful KL2 and TL1 application as a part of the CTSI renewal, and this year helped develop and launch a new postdoctoral fellowship program in the early translational sciences. I have been a member of the CTSI Board for the past 3 years, helping to shape the strategic direction of CTSI during leadership transition and the CTSI renewal.

This year I helped conceive, organize and lead a national summit convened by the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to explore the role of precision approaches in public and population health. The Precision Public Health Summit: the First 1000 Days of Life brought together over 100 national thought leaders in precision medicine, public health, child health, philanthropy, data sciences, and technology to explore the role of big data and new technologies to address public health challenges during the first 1000 days of life. I currently am leading efforts at UCSF to expand the local and national discussion of how precision medicine will have an impact on public and population health.

I am currently the Chair of the US Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) - an independent body that helps set national guidelines related to clinical preventive services. I have been a member of the USPSTF since 2010 and the vice-chair from 2014-2016. I have co-authored over 50 USPSTF recommendation statements (listed under "Other Publications"), including leading more than 20 statements as chair or vice-chair.
