A BILL

To direct the Federal Communications Commission to extend to private land use restrictions its rule relating to reasonable accommodation of amateur service communications.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Amateur Radio Parity
5 Act of 2015”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds the following:

1 (1) More than 700,000 radio amateurs in the
2 United States are licensed by the Federal Commu-
3 nications Commission in the amateur radio service.

4 (2) Amateur radio, at no cost to taxpayers, pro-
5 vides a fertile ground for technical self-training in
6 modern telecommunications, electronics technology,
7 and emergency communications techniques and pro-
8 tocols.

9 (3) There is a strong Federal interest in the ef-
10 fective performance of amateur radio stations estab-
11 lished at the residences of licensees. Such stations
12 have been shown to be frequently and increasingly
13 precluded by unreasonable private land use restric-
14 tions, including restrictive covenants.

15 (4) Federal Communications Commission regu-
16 lations have for three decades prohibited the applica-
17 tion to amateur radio stations of State and local reg-
18 ulations that preclude or fail to reasonably accom-
19 modate amateur service communications, or that do
20 not constitute the minimum practicable regulation to
21 accomplish a legitimate State or local purpose. Com-
22 mission policy has been and is to permit erection of
23 a station antenna structure at heights and dimen-
24 sions sufficient to accommodate amateur service
25 communications.

1 (5) The Federal Communications Commission
2 has sought guidance and direction from Congress
3 with respect to the application of the Commission’s
4 limited preemption policy regarding amateur radio
5 communications to private land use restrictions, in-
6 cluding restrictive covenants.

7 **SEC. 3. ACCOMMODATION OF AMATEUR SERVICE COMMU-**
8 **NICATIONS.**

9 Not later than 120 days after the date of the enact-
10 ment of this Act, the Federal Communications Commis-
11 sion shall amend section 97.15(b) of title 47, Code of Fed-
12 eral Regulations, so that such section prohibits application
13 to amateur service communications of any private land use
14 restriction, including a restrictive covenant, that—

15 (1) precludes such communications;

16 (2) fails to reasonably accommodate such com-
17 munications; or

18 (3) does not constitute the minimum practicable
19 restriction on such communications to accomplish
20 the legitimate purpose of the private entity seeking
21 to enforce such restriction.

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
