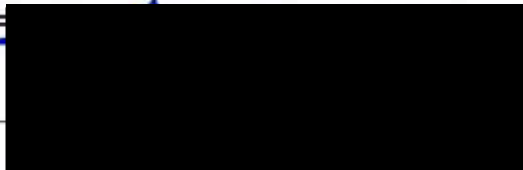

**Thomas A. (Tam) Murray, Founder & Managing Member,
Community Wireless Structures**

Community Wireless Structures (CWS) has developed wireless sites in Northern and Central Virginia since 1997. CWS focuses on geographic areas where zoning barriers are high and demand for wireless service is growing. Under Murray's leadership, the CWS team has developed 51 sites, and twice negotiated the sale of mature assets to large tower companies. Prior to establishing a wireless infrastructure career, Tam Murray worked in commercial real estate brokerage from 1985 through 1998 leasing and selling office buildings in the Edge Cities of Northern Virginia. Mr. Murray holds an MBA from the University of Virginia's Darden School and a degree in history from Williams College. Mr. Murray joined the WIA board (then PCIA) in February of 2003. From 2010-2015, Murray co-chaired WIA's Infrastructure Developers Forum (IDF), a group of top U. S. tower developers that meets twice annually to share and discuss best practices. In April of 2015, Murray commenced a 2-year term as chairman of WIA.
