**SUBCOMMITTEE ON COMMUNICATIONS AND TECHNOLOGY  
MARKUP**

**THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 2019**

The Subcommittee on Communications and Technology met, pursuant to notice, in open markup session at 11:30 a.m., a quorum being present, in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, Hon. Mike Doyle, *the chairman*, presiding. The markup session convened at 11:33 a.m. to consider nine bills pending before the subcommittee. The following actions were taken:

1. **H.R. 4229**, the “Broadband Deployment Accuracy and Technological Availability (BROADBAND DATA) Act”, (*Reps. Loeb sack (D-IA), Latta (R-OH), McEachin (D-VA), and Long (R-MO)*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.

The following amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 4229:

- An amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS), # **1** (ANS\_02), offered by Rep. Loeb sack, was agreed to, amended, by a voice vote;
- An amendment offered by Rep. O’Halleran (D-AZ), on behalf of himself and Reps. Bilirakis (R-FL), Luján (D-NM), and Walberg (R-MI), to the Loeb sack AINS, # **1a** (D\_AMDT\_01), was agreed to by a voice vote.

2. **H.R. 4227**, the “Mapping Accuracy Promotes Services (MAPS) Act”, (*Reps. McEachin (D-VA), Long, Loeb sack, and Latta*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote.

No amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 4227.

3. **H.R. 5000**, the “Studying How to Harness Airwaves Resources Efficiently (SHARE) Act of 2019”, (*Reps. Doyle (D-PA) and Latta*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote.

No amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 5000.

4. **H.R. 4998**, the “Secure and Trusted Communications Networks Act”, (*Reps. Pallone (D-NJ), Walden (R-OR), Matsui (D-CA), and Guthrie (R-KY)*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 4998:

- An amendment, # **1** (MGE\_01), offered by Rep. Pallone on behalf of himself and Rep. Walden, was agreed to by a voice vote.

5. **H.R. 4461**, the “Network Security Information Sharing Act of 2019”, (*Reps. Kinzinger (R-IL) and Doyle*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 4461:

- An amendment, # 1 (SLW\_1056), offered by Rep. Kinzinger, was agreed to by a voice vote.

6. **H.R. 2881**, the “Secure 5G and Beyond Act of 2019”, (*Reps. Spanberger (D-VA), Stefanik (R-NY), Slotkin (D-MI), Rooney (R-FL), O’Halleran, and Brooks (R-IN)*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.

The following amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 2881:

- An amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS), # 1 (SLW\_1055), offered by Rep. O’Halleran on behalf of himself and Rep. Brooks, was agreed to, amended, by a voice vote.
- An amendment to the O’Halleran AINS, offered by Rep. Cárdenas (D-CA) on behalf of himself and Mrs. Brooks, was agreed to by a voice vote.

7. **H.R. 4500**, the “Promoting United States Wireless Leadership Act of 2019”, (*Reps. Walberg, Dingell (D-MI), and Brooks*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 4500:

- An amendment, # 1 (WALBER\_063), offered by Rep. Walberg on behalf of himself and Reps. Dingell, Brooks, and Clarke (D-NY), was agreed to by a voice vote.

8. **H. Res. 575**, Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that all stakeholders in the deployment of 5G communications infrastructure should carefully consider and adhere to the recommendations of the “The Prague Proposals”, (*Reps. Flores (R-TX) and Soto (D-FL)*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H. Res. 575:

- An amendment, # 1 (FLORES\_043), offered by Rep. Flores, was agreed to by a voice vote.

9. **H.R. 5035**, the “Television Viewer Protection Act of 2019”, (*Rep. Doyle*), was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote.

No amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 5035.

Whereupon, there being no further business to come before the Subcommittee, Mr. Doyle adjourned the markup session at 1:04 p.m., subject to the call of the chair.
