Dear PRIDE HIO:

As of July 9, 2012, the final rule requiring horse industry organizations and associations (HIOs) to assess and enforce minimum penalties under the Horse Protection Act (HPA) has become effective. *See* 9 C.F.R. § 11.25. On July 23, 2012, USDA notified Professional Regulation and Inspection for Dedicated Equestrians (PRIDE) HIO of its failure to comply with the final rule and provided PRIDE HIO with the opportunity to rectify this failure or adequately explain it to the satisfaction of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) within 5 business days from receipt of the letter. On July 27, 2012, PRIDE HIO sent USDA a letter stating its reasons for not implementing the final rule.

As of today, August 1, 2012, PRIDE HIO has failed to submit an amended rulebook demonstrating that it is assessing and enforcing the minimum penalties outlined in the final rule. PRIDE HIO's letter of July 27, 2012 also failed to adequately explain its noncompliance to the satisfaction of the Department. Consequently, this letter serves as PRIDE HIO's initial notice that its DQP program certification has been revoked pursuant to 9 C.F.R. '11.7(g). PRIDE HIO may appeal this revocation to the Administrator within 30 days from receipt of this letter and request a hearing which will be held in accordance with the Uniform Rules of Practice for the Department of Agriculture in subpart H of part 1, subtitle A, title 7, Code of Federal Regulations (7 CFR 1.130 *et seq.*). All DQP licenses PRIDE HIO has issued will expire 30 days after the effective date of revocation of its certification program, or 15 days after the date the revocation becomes final after appeal, unless such licenses are transferred to an HIO having a program currently certified by the Department.
