## SUBCOMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENT AND CLIMATE CHANGE MARKUP

## THURSDAY, MARCH 12, 2020

The Subcommittee on Environment and Climate Change met, pursuant to notice, in open markup session at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, March 12, 2020, in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, Hon. Paul Tonko, *the chairman*, presiding. The markup session convened at 9:03 a.m. to consider two bills pending before the subcommittee. The following actions were taken:

1. H.R. 6160, to extend the chemical facility anti-terrorism standards program of the Department of Homeland Security, (*Reps. Thompson (D-MS), Pallone (D-NJ), Richmond (D-LA), and Tonko (D-NY))*, was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote.

No amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 6160.

 H.R. 5544, the "American Innovation and Manufacturing Leadership Act of 2020", (*Reps. Tonko, Olson (R-TX), Peters (D-CA), and Stefanik (R-NY))*, was forwarded favorably to the full Committee, **amended**, by a record vote of 13 yeas to 9 nays (roll call no. ECC-03), a quorum being present.

The following amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 5544:

- Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) # 1 (HR5544\AINS\_01), offered by Mr. Peters (D-CA), was **agreed** to by a voice vote;
- Amendment # 1a (R\_04) to the Peters AINS # 1, offered by Mr. Shimkus, was **defeated** by a record vote of 9 yeas to 10 nays (roll call no. ECC-01);
- Amendment # 1b (R\_01) to the Peters AINS # 1, offered by Mr. Shimkus, was **defeated** by a record vote of 9 yeas to 13 nays (roll call no. ECC-02).

Whereupon, there being no further business to come before the Subcommittee, Mr. Tonko adjourned the markup session at 10:48 a.m., subject to the call of the chair.
