

COMMITTEE MARKUP ACTION SUMMARY REPORT

The Committee on Natural Resources met in open session on December 4, 2013, to consider the following bills:

H.R. 915 (Kennedy), To authorize the Peace Corps Commemorative Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 915 by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1425 (Bonamici), To amend the Marine Debris Act to better address severe marine debris events, and for other purposes (*Marine Debris Emergency Act of 2013*).

The Subcommittee on Fisheries, Wildlife, Oceans and Insular Affairs was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1425 by unanimous consent.

- An amendment offered by Mr. Young of Alaska.002 was AGREED TO by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives, as amended, by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1491 (Bonamici), To authorize the Administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to provide certain funds to eligible entities for activities undertaken to address the marine debris impacts of the March 2011 Tohoku earthquake and subsequent tsunami, and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Fisheries, Wildlife, Oceans and Insular Affairs was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1491 by unanimous consent.

- An amendment offered by Mr. Young of Alaska.002 was AGREED TO by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives, as amended, by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2319 (Mullin), To clarify certain provisions of the Native American Veterans' Memorial Establishment Act of 1994 (*Native American Veterans' Memorial Amendments Act of 2013*).

The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation, and Subcommittee on Indian and Alaska Native Affairs were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2319 by unanimous consent.

- An amendment offered by Mr. Mullin #1 was AGREED TO by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives, as amended, by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3286 (Daines), To direct the Secretary of the Treasury to reimburse States that use State funds to operate National Parks during the Federal Government shutdown, and for other purposes (*Protecting States, Opening National Parks Act*).

The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3286 by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

S. 230 (Portman), A bill to authorize the Peace Corps Commemorative Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation was discharged from further consideration of S. 230 by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.
