

COMMITTEE MARKUP ACTION

The Committee on Natural Resources met in open session on Tuesday, July 25, 2017, and reconvened on Wednesday, July 26, 2017, to consider the following bills:

H.R. 825 (Rep. Paul Gosar), To promote the development of renewable energy on public land, and for other purposes. *"Public Land Renewable Energy Development Act of 2017"*

The Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 825 by unanimous consent.

An Amendment offered by Mr. Gosar (001), was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 825, as amended, was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 873 (Rep. Mike Gallagher), To authorize the Global War on Terror Memorial Foundation to establish the National Global War on Terrorism Memorial as a commemorative work in the District of Columbia, and for other purposes. *"Global War on Terrorism War Memorial Act"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 873 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 873 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 965 (Rep. Ann Kuster), To redesignate the Saint-Gaudens National Historic Site as the "Saint-Gaudens National Historical Park", and for other purposes. *"Saint-Gaudens National Historical Park Redesignation Act"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 965 by unanimous consent.

An Amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah (#1), was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 965, as amended, was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1074 (Rep. Rod Blum), To repeal the Act entitled "An Act to confer jurisdiction on the State of Iowa over offenses committed by or against Indians on the Sac and Fox Indian Reservation".

The Subcommittee on Indian, Insular and Alaska Native Affairs was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1074 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1074 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1418 (Rep. Don Young of AK), To amend the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act to provide that Alexander Creek, Alaska, is and shall be recognized as an eligible Native village under that Act, and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Indian, Insular and Alaska Native Affairs was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1418 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1418 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1491 (Rep. Doug LaMalfa), To reaffirm the action of the Secretary of the Interior to take land into trust for the benefit of the Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Mission Indians, and for other purposes. *"Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Indians Land Affirmation Act of 2017"*

The Subcommittee on Indian, Insular and Alaska Native Affairs was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1491 by unanimous consent.

An Amendment offered by Mr. LaMalfa (#1), was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1491, as amended, was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1547 (Rep. Martha McSally), To provide for the unencumbering of title to non-Federal land owned by the city of Tucson, Arizona, for purposes of economic development by conveyance of the Federal reversionary interest to the City. *"Udall Park Land Exchange Completion Act"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1547 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1547 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2075 (Rep. Greg Walden), To adjust the eastern boundary of the Deschutes Canyon-Steelhead Falls Wilderness Study Area in the State of Oregon to facilitate fire prevention

and response activities in order to protect adjacent private property, and for other purposes. *"Crooked River Ranch Fire Protection Act"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2075 by unanimous consent.

An Amendment offered by Mr. McClintock (#1), was agreed to by voice vote.

An Amendment offered by Mr. Grijalva (043), was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 14 yeas and 19 nays.

H.R. 2075, as amended, was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 20 yeas and 13 nays.

H.R. 2083 (Rep. Jaime Herrera Beutler), To amend the Marine Mammal Protection Act of 1972 to reduce predation on endangered Columbia River salmon and other nonlisted species, and for other purposes. *"Endangered Salmon and Fisheries Predation Prevention Act"*

The Subcommittee on Water, Power and Oceans was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2083 by unanimous consent.

An Amendment offered by Mr. Huffman (003), was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 14 yeas and 20 nays.

H.R. 2083 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 21 yeas and 14 nays.

H.R. 2199 (Rep. Kevin Cramer), To improve Federal land management, resource conservation, environmental protection, and use of Federal real property, by requiring the Secretary of the Interior to develop a multipurpose cadastre of Federal real property and identifying inaccurate, duplicate, and out-of-date Federal land inventories, and for other purposes. *"Federal Land Asset Inventory Reform Act of 2017"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands and the Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2199 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2199 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2316 (Rep. Glenn Thompson of PA), To amend the Mineral Leasing Act and the Energy Policy Act of 1992 to repeal provisions relating only to the Allegheny National Forest. *"Cooperative Management of Mineral Rights Act of 2017"*

The Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2316 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2316 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2371 (Rep. Paul Gosar), To require the Administrator of the Western Area Power Administration to establish a pilot project to provide increased transparency for customers, and for other purposes. *“Western Area Power Administration Transparency Act”*

The Subcommittee on Water, Power and Oceans was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2371 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2371 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2374 (Rep. Ruben Kihuen), To facilitate certain pinyon-juniper related projects in Lincoln County, Nevada, to modify the boundaries of certain wilderness areas in the State of Nevada, and to fully implement the White Pine County Conservation, Recreation, and Development Act. *“Eastern Nevada Economic Development and Land Management Improvement Act”*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2374 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2374 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2423 (Rep. Chris Stewart), To implement certain measures relating to management of Washington County, Utah, required by Public Law 111-11. *“Washington County, Utah, Public Lands Management Implementation Act”*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2423 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2423 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 19 yeas and 15 nays.

H.R. 2582 (Rep. Mia Love), To authorize the State of Utah to select certain lands that are available for disposal under the Pony Express Resource Management Plan to be used for

the support and benefit of State institutions, and for other purposes. *"Confirming State Land Grants for Education Act"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2582 by unanimous consent.

An Amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah (#1), was agreed to by unanimous consent.

An Amendment offered by Mr. Grijalva (001), was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2582, as amended, was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2611 (Rep. J. French Hill), To modify the boundary of the Little Rock Central High School National Historic Site, and for other purposes. *"Little Rock Central High School National Historic Site Boundary Modification Act"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2611 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2611 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2615 (Rep. Steven Palazzo), To authorize the exchange of certain land located in Gulf Islands National Seashore, Jackson County, Mississippi, between the National Park Service and the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and for other purposes. *"Gulf Islands National Seashore Land Exchange Act of 2017"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2615 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2615 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2768 (Rep. Scott Tipton), To designate certain mountain peaks in the State of Colorado as "Fowler Peak" and "Boskoff Peak". *"Fowler and Boskoff Peaks Designation Act"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2768 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2768 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3115 (Rep. Richard Nolan), To provide for a land exchange involving Federal land in the Superior National Forest in Minnesota acquired by the Secretary of Agriculture through the Weeks Law, and for other purposes. *"Superior National Forest Land Exchange Act of 2017"*

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands and the Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3115 by unanimous consent.

An Amendment offered by Mr. Westerman (#1), was agreed to by voice vote.

H.R. 3115, as amended, was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 26 yeas and 10 nays.

H.R. 3279 (Rep. Paul Cook), To amend the Mineral Leasing Act to provide that extraction of helium from gas produced under a Federal mineral lease shall maintain the lease as if the helium were oil and gas. *"Helium Extraction Act of 2017"*

H.R. 3279 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3281 (Rep. Doug Lamborn), To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to facilitate the transfer to non-Federal ownership of appropriate reclamation projects or facilities, and for other purposes. *"Reclamation Title Transfer and Non-Federal Infrastructure Incentivization Act."*

An Amendment offered by Mr. Huffman (087), was offered and withdrawn.

H.R. 3281 was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 12 nays.
