

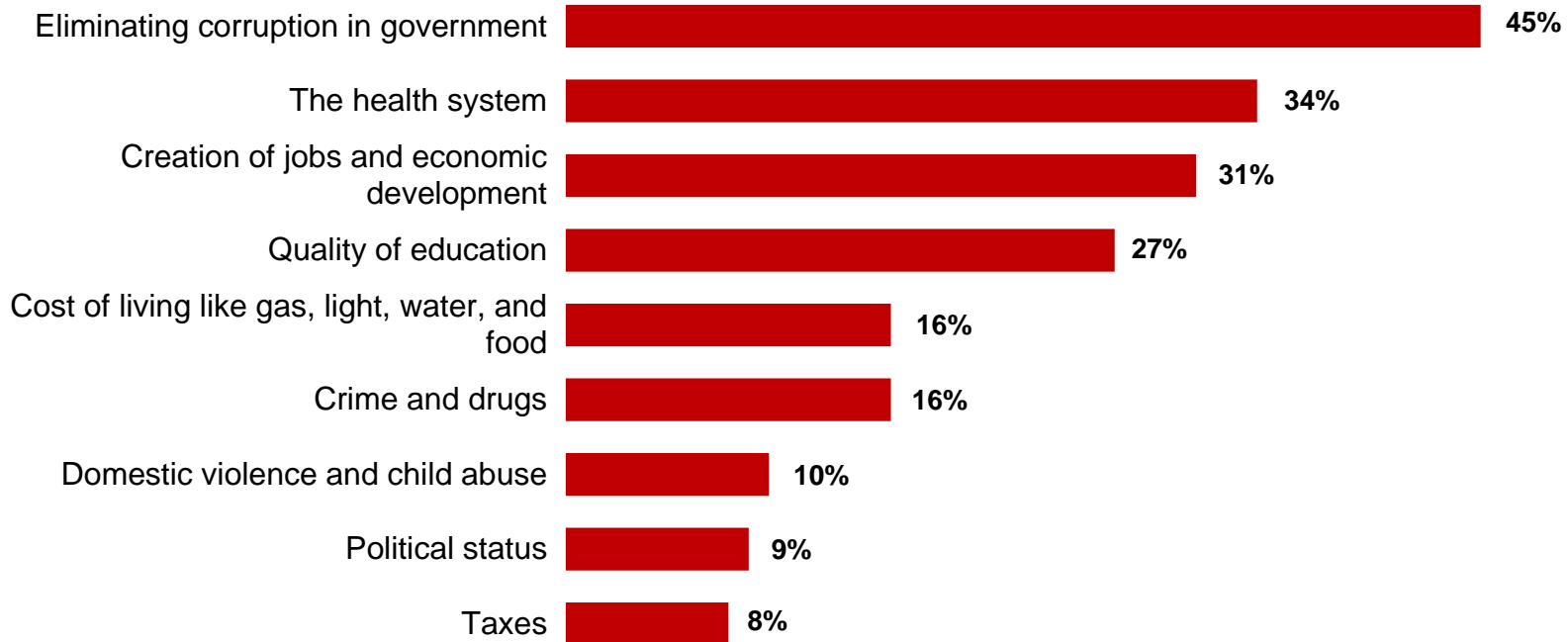


Views on Political Status among Puerto Rican Voters

Results from a telephone survey of 605 Registered Voters in Puerto Rico conducted from July 20-August 9, 2020

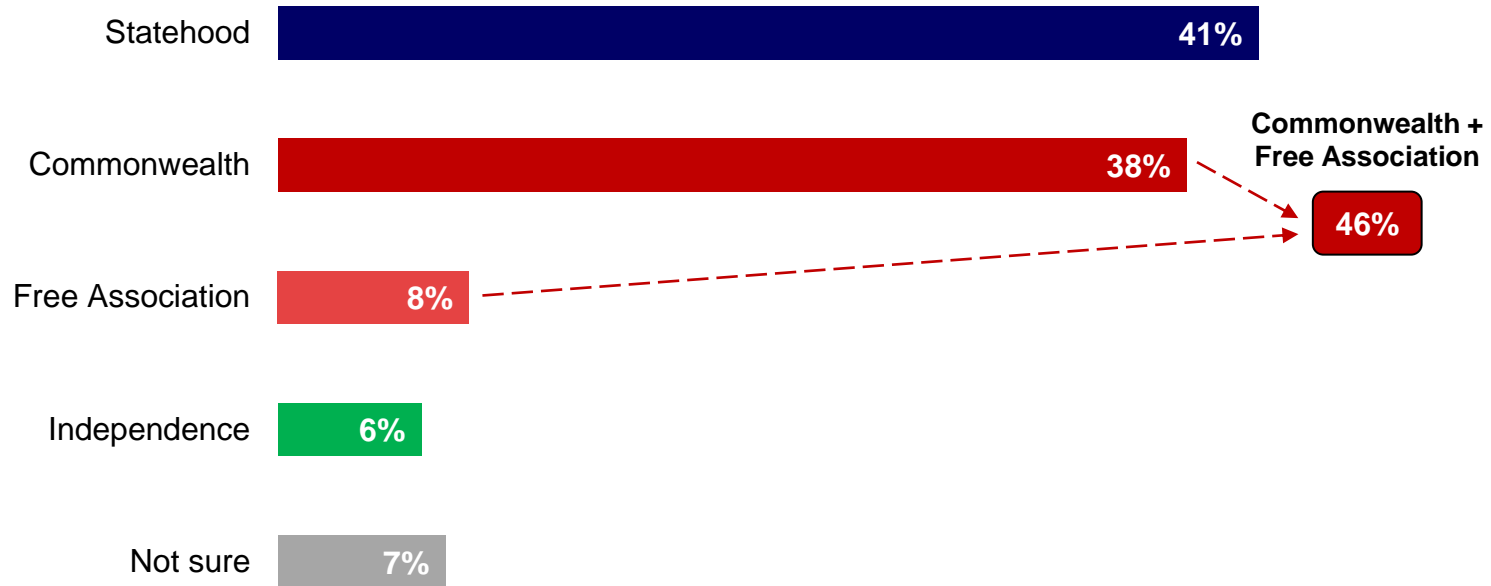
Eliminating corruption in government is the most important issue facing Puerto Rico. Few Puerto Ricans cite status.

Which are the one or two most important issues that government can address to improve the situation in Puerto Rico?



When presented with status options, Statehood is slightly ahead of Commonwealth. Combined, Commonwealth and Free Association receive greater support.

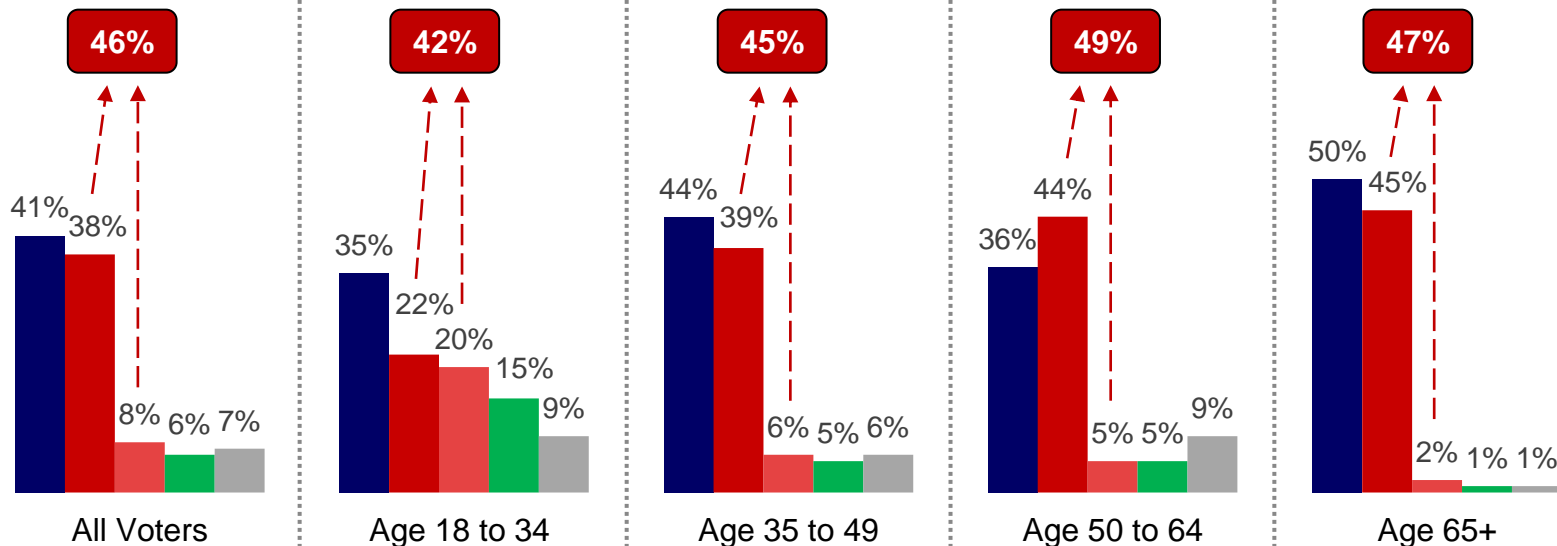
If a plebiscite on status were held, how would you vote....



Younger Puerto Ricans, the next generation, are least supportive of Statehood. Only among the oldest Puerto Ricans is there a slight preference for Statehood.

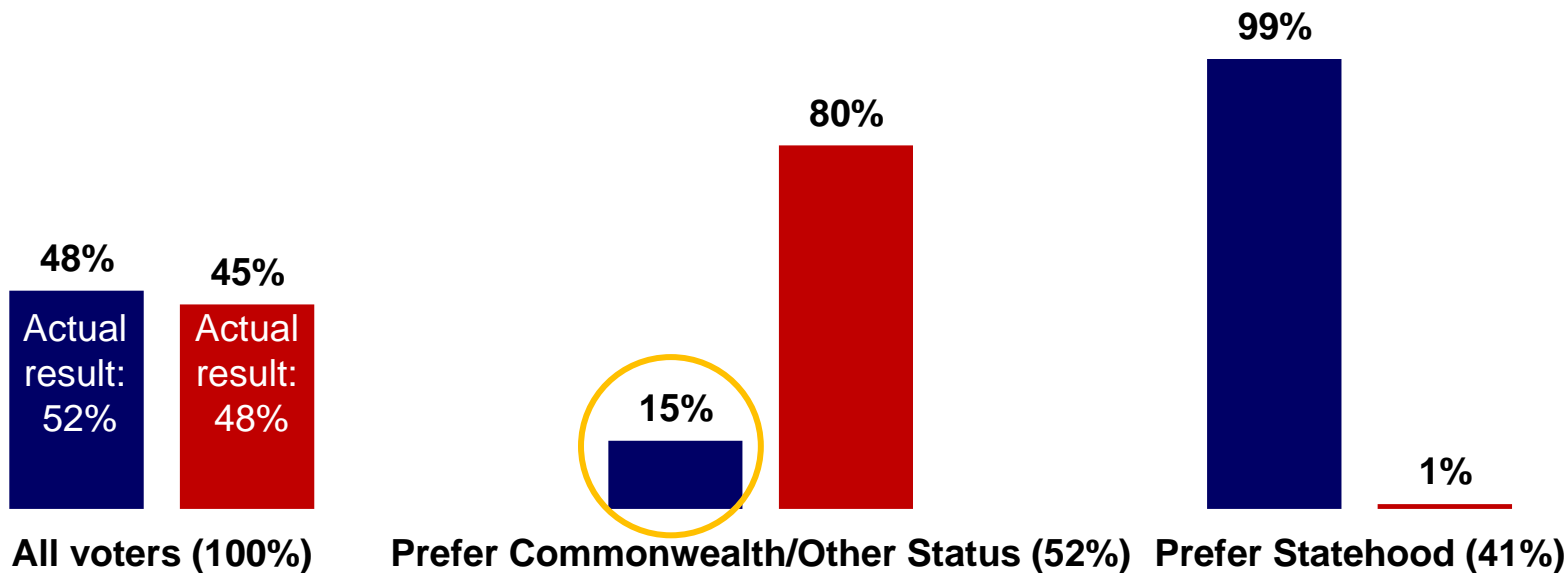
If a plebiscite on status were held, how would you vote....

Like the actual plebiscite, there is a slight preference for “Yes” – but this includes support from voters who prefer another Status option if given a choice.

Most voters do not believe that the plebiscite on Status is a serious proposal, including 3 in 4 voters who prefer Commonwealth or another Status option.

- This is not a serious proposal to deal with the status issue and is being done for political purposes
- This is being done as a serious proposal to resolve the status issue
