RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Supporting H.R. 2579 "Hardrock Leasing and Reclamation Act of 2019")

RESOLUTION NO. 19-462

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2		the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
3		education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"
4		and to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal
5		agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation and
6		all federal appropriation estimates and projects for the benefit of the Tohono
7		O'odham Nation" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j)); and
8	WHEREAS,	hardrock mining on public lands in the United States for gold, silver, copper and
9		other resources has for more than 150 years been governed by the Mining Law of
10		1872 and related Federal laws that opened public lands to private mining claims
11		through a claim-staking and land-patenting process; and
12	WHEREAS,	the Mining Law of 1872 favors hardrock mining over all other uses of public lands
13		and thereby restricts the ability of Federal agencies to protect tribal sacred sites,
14	,	wildlife, water, and other resources impacted by mining; and
15	WHEREAS,	hardrock mines on public lands have polluted 40 percent of the river and stream
16		headwaters in the western United States with toxic substances and have left over
17		500,000 mines abandoned on public lands without remediation or reclamation;
18		and
19	WHEREAS,	on May 8, 2019, Rep. Raul Grijalva introduced H.R. 2579 "Hardrock Leasing and
20		Reclamation Act of 2019," which would substantially reform the 1872 Mining law
21		and other laws applicable to mineral prospecting, claiming, mining and
22		reclamation on Federal lands; and
23	WHEREAS,	H.R. 2579 would, among other things, end the claim-patenting system for mining
24		on public lands, increase the royalties paid by large hardrock mines, require
25		consultation with tribal governments about mines that would impact tribal
26		interests, prohibit mining in national parks, national wildlife refuges and other
27		specially-designated lands and impose stricter measures to insure reclamation
28		of closed mines and mitigation of environmental impacts; and
29	WHEREAS,	the Agricultural and Natural Resources Committee has reviewed H.R. 2579 and
30		recommends its support.
31	NOW, THERE	FORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council supports H.R. $$
32		2579 "Hardrock Leasing and Reclamation Act of 2019" or similar legislation that
33		would reform federal mining laws, including the 1872 Mining law, to end the
34		claim-staking and patenting system, prohibit mining in sensitive areas, require
35		tribal consultation about potential mining activities that could impact Indian

tribal interests, require mining operations to better mitigate impacts to natural and cultural resources and mandate more actions to reclaim closed and abandoned mines. The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 04^{TH} day of DECEMBER, 2019 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,931.2 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 244.5 [05] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
