



Todd A. Hoffman, serves as the Executive Director, Admissibility and Passenger Programs, Office of Field Operations, US Customs and Border Protection, Washington, DC. He leads a staff of over 120 staff and field employees and has oversight of a budget in excess of \$110 million related to all national Immigration and Traveler Policy for ports of entry within CBP, the Electronic Secure Travel Authorization (ESTA) for Visa Waiver Program, Admissibility Review Office, Fraudulent Document Analysis Unit, and Advance Passenger Information, along with Trusted Traveler Programs.

Mr. Hoffman has served as Area Port Director at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) since 2011. In this role, he has overseen international passenger inspections, immigration and trade enforcement, narcotics interdictions, agricultural inspections, and airport security programs at LAX and other airport facilities, including Las Vegas McCarran International Airport, Ontario International Airport, and the Torrance International Mail Facility. These operations screen approximately 10 million passengers and over one million cargo shipments annually. Prior to this position, Mr. Hoffman served as the Area Port Director of the Los Angeles/Long Beach Seaport, the nation's largest seaport complex from 2006 to 2011.

From 2001 to 2006, Mr. Hoffman served at OFO Headquarters as Director for the Non-Intrusive Inspection Division and Program Manager for the Anti-Smuggling Division. From 1999 to 2001, he was assigned to Newark International Airport, where he supervised airport operations for the U.S. Customs Service. Mr. Hoffman also served an earlier tour of duty at Headquarters as a Program Officer for Outbound Programs from March 1996 to March 1999, where he managed export enforcement and anti-terrorism programs. He began his Customs career in 1991 as an Inspector in Buffalo, New York.

Mr. Hoffman is a career member of the Senior Executive Service and has completed management development programs at Columbia University's School of Business, Harvard

University's John F. Kennedy School of Government, and the Naval Postgraduate School. He graduated from Michigan State University in 1990.
