Phil Goldberg co-chairs Shook's Washington, D.C.-based Public Policy Group and has more than 25 years of experience addressing liability-related public policy and public affairs issues. Since joining Shook in 2003, he has focused his practice on liability public policy matters in front of Congress, state legislatures, and appellate courts. He has testified before a number of state legislatures; filed *amicus* briefs with the Supreme Court of the United States, U.S. Courts of Appeal and state courts at every level; and has authored legal scholarship on some of the highest profile liability issues in the last decade. He regularly speaks at judicial and attorney conferences and has become a resource for reporters who write on liability issues. He also counsels Fortune 500 companies and their trade association on a wide variety of liability public policy issues.

Phil's specialty is tort and product liability theories and defenses. He has extensive experience with the tort of public nuisance, having written articles, filed *amicus* briefs, and given presentations on cases that would expand the tort. His public nuisance scholarship has been cited by the Supreme Courts of New Jersey and Rhode Island in denying such claims. He also has significant experience with climate change litigation, pharmaceutical liability, asbestos litigation, damages in animal injury claims, and many other areas of tort and product liability law.

Internationally, Phil has worked extensively on biotechnology liability issues as counsel to Croplife International. Along with others, he developed an industry-wide mechanism (commonly called "The Compact") to use international arbitration should a country claim that the release of a living modified organism damaged biodiversity. In doing so, he facilitated multinational dialogues on "The Compact" in Europe, Africa, Latin America and Asia. "The Compact" also facilitated industry involvement with the United Nation's Nagoya-Kuala Lumpur Supplementary Protocol on Liability and Redress to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety.

In 2011, Phil was admitted to the American Law Institute, which publishes the Restatement of Torts and other important legal treatises and projects. In 2015, he became the Director of the Progressive Policy Institute's Center for Civil Justice, and in 2019 he was named Special Counsel to the Manufacturer's Accountability Project, which is affiliated with the National Association of Manufacturers. Within the firm, he has served as the Office Managing Partner for Shook's Washington, D.C. office since 2016 and has earned Shook's Mosaic Award for commitment to diversity in the practice of law.
