

Katy Ramsey Mason is an Assistant Professor of Law and Director of the Medical-Legal Partnership Clinic at the University of Memphis Cecil C. Humphreys School of Law. Prior to joining the Memphis Law faculty in 2018, she was a Visiting Associate Professor of Clinical Law and Friedman Fellow at the George Washington University Law School. From 2011 to 2015, she was an Equal Justice Works AmeriCorps Legal Fellow and Housing Attorney at Lenox Hill Neighborhood House in New York City, where she represented low-income tenants and families in eviction cases and other housing-related matters. Her scholarship focuses on landlord-tenant law, the eviction court process, and poverty law, and her recent work has appeared in the *UCLA Law Review* and the *University of St. Thomas Journal of Law and Public Policy*. She has published opinion pieces on landlord-tenant law and evictions in the *Chicago Tribune*, the *Commercial Appeal*, and *The Conversation*, and has been quoted in various news outlets, including the *Associated Press* and *CBS News*. She received her J.D. and M.A. in Latin American Studies from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and her B.A. from Middlebury College.
