- H.R. 5047** – To require the Administrator of General Services to conduct an annual audit of properties leased to private parties, and for other purposes. The “GSA Lease Transparency Act of 2019”.
- H.R. 5119** – To amend title 49, United States Code, to require certain air carriers to provide reports with respect to maintenance, preventive maintenance, or alterations, and for other purposes. The “Safe Aircraft Maintenance Standards Act”.
- H.R. 5120** – To amend title 49, United States Code, to provide enhanced safety and environmental protection in pipeline transportation, and for other purposes. The “SAFER Pipelines Act of 2019”.
- H.R. 5139** – To protect transportation personnel and passengers from sexual assault and harassment, and for other purposes. The “Stop Sexual Assault and Harassment in Transportation Act”.
