The Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure met at 11:00 a.m. in 2167 Rayburn House Office Building and virtually, pursuant to notice, in an open session, a quorum being present, and considered the following measures:

- H.R. 390, To redesignate the Federal building located at 167 North Main Street in Memphis, Tennessee as the “Odell Horton Federal Building”.
- H.R. 468, To amend title 49, United States Code, to permit the use of incentive payments to expedite certain federally financed airport development projects. The *Expedited Delivery of Airport Infrastructure Act of 2021*.
- H.R. 539, To amend the Disaster Recovery Reform Act of 2018 to require the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to waive certain debts owed to the United States related to covered assistance provided to an individual or household, and for other purposes. The *Preventing Disaster Revictimization Act*.
- H.R. 587, To modify permitting requirements with respect to the discharge of any pollutant from the Point Loma Wastewater Treatment Plant in certain circumstances, and for other purposes. The *Ocean Pollution Reduction Act II*.
- H.R. 610, To amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to establish a grant program to support the restoration of San Francisco Bay. The *San Francisco Bay Restoration Act*.
- H.R. 1144, To amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to provide assistance for programs and activities to protect the water quality of Puget Sound, and for other purposes. The *Promoting United Government Efforts to Save our Sound Act*.
- H.R. 1262, To establish a task force on improvements for certain notices to airmen, and for other purposes. The *Notice to Airmen Improvement Act of 2021*.
- H.R. 1703, To amend title 40, United States Code, to require the Administrator of General Services to enter into a cooperative agreement with the National Children's Museum to provide the National Children's Museum rental space without charge in the Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center, and for other purposes. The *National Children's Museum Act*.
- H.R. 1765, To prohibit the Secretary of the Army from implementing a proposed rule relating to restricted access to the Washington Channel in Washington, D.C., and for other purposes. The *Washington Channel Public Access Act*.
- H.R. 1917, To modify eligibility requirements for certain hazard mitigation assistance programs, and for other purposes. The *Hazard Eligibility and Local Projects Act*.
- H.R. 1921, To amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to reauthorize the Lake Pontchartrain Basin Restoration Program, and for other purposes.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio that, the Chair, after consultation with the Ranking Member, has authority to strike or revise any provision of the bills ordered reported today that would cause a sequential referral to another committee, or that would cause the

bills to concurrent resolutions to be subject to a Budget Act of Rule 21 PAYGO point of order, was NOT OBJECTED TO.
