



Javier Saade is Founder & Managing Partner of Impact Master Holdings and Venture Partner at Fenway Summer Ventures. Impact Master Holdings invests in and helps build companies that touch on technology, digital inclusion, economic development, impact capital and social entrepreneurship. Fenway Summer is a venture firm that is an early partner to entrepreneurs and has backed about 50 companies innovating at the intersection of finance and technology.

He serves on the Board of Trustees of the Organization of American States' Pan American Development Foundation, Board of Trustees of The Nature Conservancy in Maryland & Washington DC, Board of Directors of Foundation for Puerto Rico and Board of Directors of a Rothschild and Presidio backed financial services firm. In addition he holds seats on the Global Board of Advisors of DocuSign, Inc. (NASDAQ: DOCU), the Corporate Social Responsibility Board of Univision Communications, Inc. and the Board of Advisors of Harvard University's Arthur Rock Center for Entrepreneurship. He is a Founding Member of Fast Company's Impact Council and a member of the National Association of Corporate Directors.

Previously, Javier was appointed by President Obama to serve as Associate Administrator of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and was its Chief of Investment and Innovation. The programs Javier ran have since inception invested \$128 billion in over 330,000 companies. He was chief executive of one of the largest capital pools in the world investing in American high growth companies, early stage technologies and startups. Javier also held a seat at the Committee for Small and Emerging Companies at the U.S. Securities & Exchange Commission (SEC) and sat on multiple White House and interagency councils and committees working on a broad economic and innovation policy agenda.

He built his career at organizations that include McKinsey & Company, Booz Allen & Hamilton, Bridgewater Associates, Abbott Laboratories and Air America, a company he co-founded. Javier held three concurrent roles during his transition back to private life as Executive in Residence at Columbia's Columbia Technology Ventures, Senior Fellow at Georgetown's Beek Center for Social Impact + Innovation and Mentor at Stanford's Latino Entrepreneurship Initiative (LBAN).

Earlier in his career Javier served on several private company and non-profit boards which include Casa Central and Designing Justice + Designing Spaces, and served as Mentor at Kauffman Foundation's Venture Capital Fellows Program and Techstars in NYC and London.

He frequently writes and speaks about financial inclusion, innovation, diversity, venture capital, economic growth, digital finance, impact investing, and entrepreneurship. His views have been shaped by his broad global experience, multi-cultural roots and change-making disposition.

Javier holds an MBA from Harvard Business School, an MS in Operations & Technology from Illinois Institute of Technology and a BS in Industrial Management with a concentration in Manufacturing Engineering from Purdue University.
