

Dylan Taylor, Chairman and CEO, Voyager Space



Dylan Taylor is a global business leader, commercial astronaut, thought leader and philanthropist. Currently, Mr. Taylor serves as Chairman & CEO of <u>Voyager Space</u>, a multi-national space exploration company focused on building the next generation of space infrastructure for NASA, global space agencies, and commercial users. As an early-stage investor in more than 50 emerging space ventures, Dylan is widely considered the most active private space investor in the world.

Dylan is a leading advocate of space manufacturing and the utilization of in-space resources to further space exploration. In 2017, he became the first private citizen to manufacture an item in space when the gravity meter he co-designed and commissioned was 3D printed on the International Space Station.

Dylan maintains an extensive philanthropic impact on the space industry. In 2017, Dylan founded the nonprofit and social movement, <u>Space for Humanity</u>, which seeks to democratize space exploration and develop solutions to global issues through the scope of human awareness to help solve the world's most intractable problems.

Building upon his passion and support for the space industry, Dylan serves as a strategic advisor for both the <u>Archmission</u> and the <u>Human Spaceflight Program</u> and is a co-founding patron of the <u>Commercial Spaceflight Federation</u>, which promotes the growth of commercial space activity. Additionally, he is also a leading benefactor to the <u>Brooke Owens Fellowship</u>, <u>Patti Grace Smith Fellowship</u> and <u>Mission: Astro Access</u>.

Dylan is a full member of the World Economic Forum and a Henry Crown Fellow of the <u>Aspen</u> <u>Institute</u>. In 2020, Dylan was recognized by the <u>Commercial Spaceflight Federation</u> with their <u>top</u> <u>honor for business and finance</u>, following in the footsteps of 2019's inaugural winner, the late Paul Allen and subsequent winners Jeff Bezos and Elon Musk.

Dylan earned an MBA in Finance and Strategy from the <u>Booth School of Business at University of</u> <u>Chicago</u> and holds a BS in Engineering from the honors college at the <u>University of Arizona</u>, where he graduated Tau Beta Pi and in 2018 was named Alumnus of the year. He is also a graduate of the Global Leadership and Public Policy for the 21st Century program at <u>Harvard University</u>.
