

## **Aaron Wright Short Narrative Biography**

Aaron Wright is an Associate Clinical Professor of Law at the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law and is the Co-Director of Cardozo's Blockchain Project. Professor Wright's research focuses on blockchain technology, and in particular smart contracts, decentralized organizations, and the regulation of autonomous code-based systems. He is the co-author of the book *Blockchain & the Law: The Rule of Code* (Harvard University Press, March 2018), and is the co-founder of the smart contract-based project OpenLaw (<http://www.openlaw.io>), built in conjunction with ConsenSys, Inc. Professor Wright serves as the chair of the Enterprise Ethereum Alliance Legal Industry Working Group, serves as an academic fellow at Coincenter, and is an editor of *Ledger*.

Professor Wright received his J.D. from the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law, where he served as the editor-in-chief of the Cardozo Law Review, and received a B.A. from Tufts University.
