On <u>Wednesday, September 21, 2022, at 2:00 p.m. E.T.</u>, the Select Subcommittee on the Coronavirus Crisis will hold a hybrid hearing on "Examining Long-Term Care in America: The Impact of the Coronavirus in Nursing Homes."

This hearing will convene in person in 2154 Rayburn House Office Building and remotely using Zoom, which has been approved by the House.

In light of current guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Office of Attending Physician (OAP), use of masks by Members and staff in the hearing room is optional. Individuals are advised that wearing a mask, particularly a properly fitted, medical-grade, filtration face mask (KN95 or N95 mask), is a very effective personal protective measure to reduce the risk of infection.
