

Richard M. Allman, MD is the Chief Consultant for Geriatrics and Extended Care for the Veterans Health Administration in Washington, DC. He is a board-certified geriatrician and is responsible for the policy and planning of programs needed by Veterans facing the challenges of aging, disability, or serious illness. These include Palliative Care, Geriatrics, nursing home care, and long term services and supports provided in home and community based settings. The annual budget for these programs is over \$7.2 billion.

Before becoming Chief Consultant in January 2014, Dr. Allman was the founding director of the Birmingham/Atlanta VA Geriatric Research, Education, and Clinical Center (GRECC). He also was the Parrish Endowed Professor of Medicine and the director of the Comprehensive Center for Healthy Aging at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB).

Dr. Allman received his MD and completed a residency in internal medicine at the West Virginia University (WVU) School of Medicine. He did a fellowship in internal medicine and obtained training in clinical epidemiology at Johns Hopkins University. In 2013, he received the Donald P. Kent Award for leadership and service from the Gerontological Society of America (GSA) and the Joseph T. Freeman Award from the Health Science Section in recognition of his research focusing on mobility, cardiovascular disease and health disparities among older adults. He is a Fellow of the American Geriatrics Society (AGS) and was recognized as the 2017 Henderson Award Winner for his contributions to providing leadership for implementing age-friendly health systems.
