Lawrence Montreuil currently serves as the Director for The American Legion's Legislative Division. His responsibilities include serving as the chief lobbyist for The American Legion and coordinating its federal lobbying activity on all legislative matters in which The American Legion is officially interested.

Lawrence served 8 years on active duty as a U.S. Marine Corps Infantry Officer and continues to serve in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve. His duties included serving as a Rifle Platoon Commander, Assistant Operations Officer, Foreign Security Force Advisor, Instructor, Operations Officer, and Company Commander. During his active military service, Lawrence deployed overseas three times to include as a Foreign Military Advisor with the Afghan National Army in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. His personal decorations include the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, and (2) Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals. After leaving active duty, Lawrence served as a Legislative Fellow in the House of Representatives for a member of congress on the House Armed Services Committee.
