

Anne Meehan is an assistant vice president for Government Relations at the Washington, DC-based American Council on Education (ACE), a membership organization that mobilizes the higher education community to shape effective public policy and foster innovative, high-quality practice. In that role, Meehan represents ACE before Congress and the Administration, and advises ACE's member institutions on a variety of federal policy and legal regulatory matters including accreditation, the Clery Act and campus safety, federal student aid, FERPA, freedom of speech issues, incentive compensation, Title IX and civil rights laws, transfer of credit, and veterans' education benefits. She also plays a central role in guiding and mobilizing the higher education community to achieve its legislative and policy objectives.

Meehan came to ACE in 2007 from the office of Sen. Susan Collins (R-ME), where she served as legal counsel and legislative assistant. She advised the senator on education and judiciary issues, including college access and financial aid, student loan programs, Pell Grants, campus-based aid, No Child Left Behind, judicial nominations, bankruptcy reform, and other matters. In 2002, she served as a staff member on the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions, Subcommittee on Children and Families. Prior to her work on Capitol Hill, Meehan was an associate at the Washington, DC office of Akin Gump Strauss Hauer & Feld LLP.

Meehan earned her AB degree in political science from Kenyon College (OH) in 1993, graduating magna cum laude and earning membership in Phi Beta Kappa. She received her JD from the Duke University School of Law in 1998 and currently is a member of the D.C. Bar.
