

Amendment to the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to Subtitle D Budget Reconciliation Legislative Recommendations Relating to Trade Adjustment Assistance offered by Mr. Arrington of Texas

The amendment would make communities harmed by job losses and decreased economic activity as a result of President Biden's partisan action to stop construction of the Keystone XL Pipeline eligible to receive TAA for Communities benefits. (TAA for Energy Workers Amendment).

AMENDMENT TO COMMITTEE PRINT
(SUBTITLE D)
OFFERED BY MR. ARRINGTON OF TEXAS

In section 133301(3), on page 41, line 10, insert the following before the period at the end of the matter proposed to be added as section 273(a) of the Trade Act of 1974: “or is a community impacted by the cancellation of the Keystone XL pipeline pursuant to subsection (c)”.

In section 133301(3), on page 43 after line 14, insert the following at the end of the matter proposed to be added as section 273 of the Trade Act of 1974:

1 “(c) ELIGIBILITY FOR COMMUNITIES IMPACTED BY
2 THE CANCELLATION OF THE KEYSTONE XL PIPELINE.—
3 A community shall be eligible for assistance under this
4 subchapter if the Secretary of Energy certifies that the
5 community has suffered job losses as a result of the deci-
6 sion to cancel the Keystone XL pipeline.”.

At the end of subsection (e)(3)(A) of section 133501, before the period at the end, insert the following: “, of which \$100,000,000 in each fiscal year shall be allocated to provide trade adjustment assistance to workers certified pursuant to subsection (c) of section

273 of the Trade Act of 1974, as added by section
133301 of this Act.”.



Amendment to the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to Subtitle D Budget Reconciliation Legislative Recommendations Relating to Trade Adjustment Assistance offered by Mr. Buchanan of Florida

The amendment would strike and replace Subtitle D with an extension of 2015 Trade Promotion Authority and Trade Adjustment Assistance legislation through 2028. (The Trade Not Aid Amendment).

5 Section 103 of the Bipartisan Congressional Trade
6 Priorities and Accountability Act of 2015 (19 U.S.C.
7 4202) is amended—

8 (1) by striking “July 1, 2018” each place it ap-
9 pears and inserting “July 1, 2025”;

10 (2) by striking “July 1, 2021” each place it ap-
11 pears and inserting “July 1, 2028”; and

12 (3) in subsection (c)—

13 (A) by striking “June 30, 2018” each
14 place it appears and inserting “June 30, 2025”;

15 (B) in paragraph (2), by striking “April 1,
16 2018” and inserting “April 1, 2025”; and

1 (C) in paragraph (3), by striking “June 1,
2 2018” each place it appears and inserting
3 “June 1, 2025”.

4 **SEC. 133002. TRADE ADJUSTMENT ASSISTANCE.**

5 (a) **EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLICABILITY.**—The provi-
6 sions of chapters 2 through 6 of title II of the Trade Act
7 of 1974, as in effect on June 30, 2021, and as amended
8 by this section, shall—

9 (1) take effect on the date of the enactment of
10 this Act; and

11 (2) apply with respect to petitions for certifi-
12 cation filed under chapter 2, 3, 4, or 6 of title II of
13 the Trade Act of 1974 on or after such date of en-
14 actment.

15 (b) **EXTENSION OF TERMINATION PROVISIONS.**—
16 Section 285 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2271
17 note) is amended by striking “2021” each place it appears
18 and inserting “2028”.

25 inserting “2028”.

5 “2021” and inserting “2028”.

7 FIRMS.—Section 255(a) of the Trade Act of 1974
8 (19 U.S.C. 2345(a)) is amended by striking “2021”
9 and inserting “2028”.

10 (3) TRADE ADJUSTMENT ASSISTANCE FOR
11 FARMERS.—Section 298 of the Trade Act of 1974
12 (19 U.S.C. 2401g(a)) is amended by striking
13 “2021” and inserting “2028”.

Amendment to the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to Subtitle D Budget Reconciliation Legislative Recommendations Relating to Trade Adjustment Assistance offered by Mrs. Walorski of Indiana

The amendment would make workers displaced by Congressional inaction to renew the Generalized System of Preferences and the Miscellaneous Tariff Bill eligible to receive TAA for Workers, and reserve \$100 million of the \$1 billion appropriated annually for these workers.

1 (d) ELIGIBILITY FOR WORKERS DISPLACED BY CON-
2 GRESSIONAL INACTION TO RENEW GSP AND MTB.—Sec-
3 tion 222 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2272), as
4 amended by subsection (c), is further amended by adding
5 at the end the following:

6 “(g) TRADE ADJUSTMENT ASSISTANCE FOR WORK-
7 ERS DISPLACED BY CONGRESSIONAL INACTION TO
8 RENEW GSP AND MTB.—Notwithstanding any other pro-
9 vision of this chapter, a group of workers covered by a
10 petition filed under section 221 shall be certified under
11 subsection (a) as eligible to apply for adjustment assist-
12 ance under this chapter if the Secretary determines that
13 such workers have become totally or partially separated
14 from the workers’ firm as a result of inaction by Congress
15 to renew the Generalized System of Preferences under title
16 V of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2461 et seq.) or
17 pass a miscellaneous tariff bill (as such term is defined
18 for purposes of the American Manufacturing Competitive-
19 ness Act of 2016).”.
